*...and many other partners*




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
# FAIR in Higher Education

- Map the integration of FAIR data principles in university curricula and teaching and **analyse the landscape of available FAIR data education** in Europe
- Deliver a **FAIR data competence framework** for higher education and professionals to support the development of a FAIR data culture and the uptake of FAIR data principles in university teaching
- Translate the competence framework into **model curricula and university courses** to support the integration of relevant content in university curricula
- Support **embedding FAIR data education in university programmes and doctoral training** through a series of workshops and knowledge-sharing activities
